




WHAT IS A CERVICAL EXAM?

Internal, vaginal exam of your cervix, the bottom of the womb between vagina and baby..

REASONS TO DO AN EXAM

- Did we go to the place of birth too early?
- Do we need to consider speeding labor along?
- Do we need more information about baby's position?
- Is there any cervix left before we start pushing?
- Should I consider pain medication or am I close enough to having my baby?
- Can you tell if my pushes are bringing baby's head down?



WHAT AN EXAM CAN SHOW YOU

- Dilation (how open)
- Effacement (how thin)
- Consistency (soft/hard)
- Position of cervix (forward/back)
- Position of baby (are they turned facing your front or your back)
- Baby's Station (how high/low the presenting part of the baby)
- If the bag of waters is intact (sometimes can tell)
- If the cervix is off to one side (sometimes means baby's in an odd position)



ERVICAL EXAMS

PROVIDER QUESTIONS

- How often do you prefer to check my cervix in pregnancy?
- · How often do you prefer to check my cervix during labor?
- How would you feel if I didn't want my cervix checked unless I needed to make a decision?
- I have a history with sexual assault. How can you best support me?

WHAT AN EXAM CAN'T SHOW YOU

- · How fast your cervix will dilate moving forward
- · How much labor you have left
- How soon your baby will be born
- · Whether or not you'll have a vaginal birth
- · How intense your labor will be
- · How big your baby is

PARTNER TIPS

- Hold their hand if they want.
- Encourage them, especially if they're not as far along as they'd like.
- · Remind them that it's all temporary
